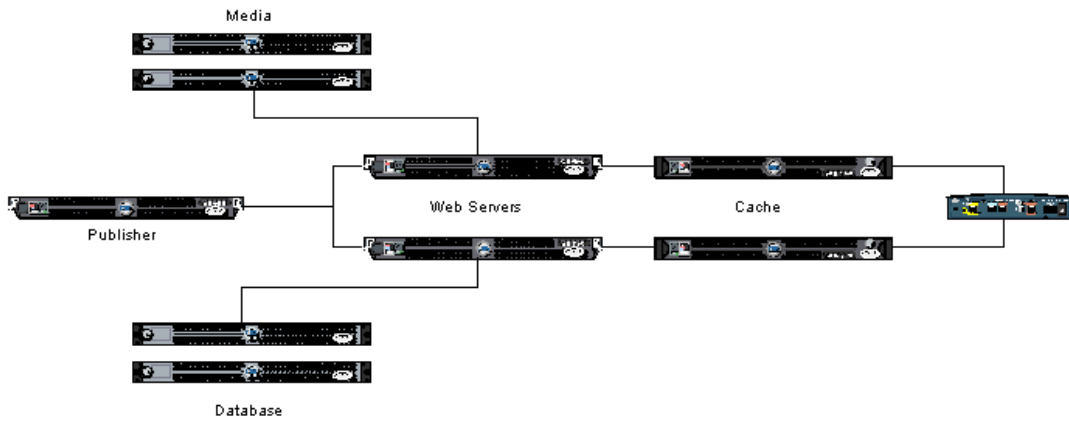
Most popular sites are Home and Away and Today Tonight
